Pastor's Column

“The noble person plans only noble things, noble his every move.” – *Isaiah 32:8*

“Whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is lovely, whatever is gracious, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things.” – *Saint Paul, Philippians 4:8*

This week gave me the first opportunity to have a joint meeting with members of the Parish and Administration Councils. It was a great meeting, and we talked about noble things and doing whatever is true, honorable, lovely, gracious, and excellent. We are blessed to have such talented and giving people serving in such important roles of parish leadership. I thank all of them for their generosity in serving our Lord and the faithful of our parish.

During the meeting I listened to the insight and wisdom that various council members had to share with a new pastor. 

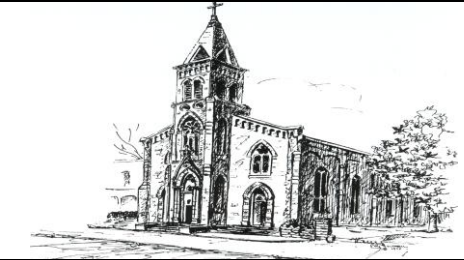
